HBA Members Build “Extreme Makeover: Home Edition” House and a Surprise Coffee Shop, HBCF Donates \$30,000

What an extraordinary week September 3, 2008, was for the Martirez family of Shrewsbury, Mo. The family was selected to receive a new handicap-accessible home from ABC-TV's “Extreme Makeover: Home Edition.”

The show relies mostly on donated materials and labor, so earlier this year the producers of “Extreme Makeover: Home Edition” came to St. Louis to solicit for builders and trade partners. HBA builder member **John Shea** of

Callier Thompson Shea Construction & Design, also known as “Mr. Fix It” on St. Louis radio's KTRS 550 AM, heard about the search for builders through his show's producer and knew he had to help. Shea recruited HBA builder and board member **Dave Dunlap** of **Consolidated Construction Group** to collaborate with the build.

Dawn Martirez was a pediatric cancer nurse who cared for terminally ill children. She never expected to use her medical expertise to care for her own

children beyond the bumps and bruises of a normal childhood. Dawn and her husband, Emmanuel, had their daughter Elle, now 7, and then became pregnant with twins, Evan and Alec, now 4.

During Dawn’s pregnancy with the twins the doctors warned her of severe complications, but Dawn refused to terminate the pregnancy. Evan was born with 9P minus syndrome, an extremely rare genetic disorder affecting an estimated 125 people in the U.S., and Alec has Crouzon Syndrome, another uncommon genetic disorder that is seen in about 16 per million newborns. Both twins suffer from skeletal abnormalities that require extensive corrective facial and cranial surgeries. Evan has physical handicaps and mental retardation and Alec is profoundly hearing impaired.

If you haven’t seen the show, a family’s old home is demolished and a new home is built from the foundation up in four days and 10 hours while the family goes on vacation. On September 4 however, Ty Pennington and the “Extreme Makeover” designers surprised a second St. Louis family – the Maleks.

Sam Malek was born in Cairo, Egypt, with cerebral palsy. He came to St. Louis for treatment when he was 4 years old. Malek, now a 44-year-old married father of two teenage sons, owns More Than Coffee, a drive-through coffee shop, located in Manchester, Mo.

Malek’s mission is to “help challenged people one cup at a time.” Malek does so by employing disabled individuals and letting his customers help decide which charitable organization will be the recipient of the coffee shop’s benevolence each month.

Now, Shea and Dunlap and a team of dedicated suppliers, trades people, volunteers, laborers and countless others had to race against time to complete two projects from the ground up. The builders turned to their HBA builder and associate friends for help.

Dozens of HBA builder and associate members contributed time, materials and labor for both builds. **The Home Builders Charitable Foundation, the charitable arm of the HBA, donated \$30,000 for an elevator so the twins can get from the garage to the main level of the house.**

After a week, the wait was finally over for both families. With the crowd chanting “Move that truck!” Malek finally saw his rundown little coffee stand transformed into an attractive drive-through coffee bar, with new equipment, heating and air conditioning and ADA compliant.

Finally, all of the waiting paid off and the Martirezs saw their new Bungalow style home with four stone and cedar columns and a big front porch, but most important a home that is accessible and safe for the boys. This is the moment the family and fans of the show wait for – the excitement, surprise and tears that makes this reality TV show one of the best. The twins led the family inside, the crowd dispersed, and the camera crews moved inside for another day of filming. You could say it’s over, but its really just begun. Thanks to all the generous HBA members and HBCF for making this happen. ■

Four Area Cities Make *Money* Magazine Lists

Four area cities recently won recognition from *Money* magazine – St. Peters, St. Charles and O’Fallon were among the 100 best places to live in the nation and Arnold was listed as one of the most affordable places. Arnold ranked 13 among the 25 most affordable communities with fewer than 50,000 residents.
